This special will expire on Friday, June 8th, 2018.

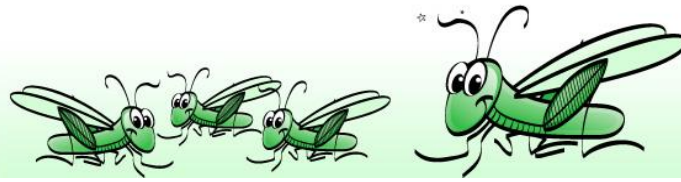
Last Day of School:

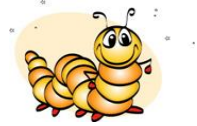
Ms. Victoria Says...

Inchworms: June has arrived! It is hard to believe the school the year is slowly coming to an end. My Inchworms had a great year filled with lots of learning and fun! It's a bittersweet feeling to see my Inchworms grow, I have truly enjoyed all of you and I am so happy to see them move into our 3 year old program, the Busy Bees. In May the Mother Day Tea was a huge success, the children enjoyed spending time with their moms just as much as you enjoyed spending time with them. The inchworms had a great time learning about the theme Under the Sea. My two favorite art projects they made were jelly fish puppets and crabs using their handprints! Their sensory bin this month was a sand foam sensory bins that has plastic shovels, small funnels, and seashells. We are slowly wrapping up on our alphabet. It was a good feeling knowing they were able to recognize the letter M that they learned previously. Moments like that remind me how much I truly love teaching. For science this month we made "Ocean" blue slime that the children giggled as they played with it. We also did a float and sink experiment in the class. The children used that time no more sensory and played with the objects, but it was still fun nevertheless. In June we will do a review of the alphabet and a review of the numbers I have introduced to them. Lastly, I want to thank you for sharing your child(ren) with me these past ten months. Ladybugs: I can't believe it! Here we are at the end of our school year! It has been an exciting month and year. Our Theme, for May, was Under the Sea which included beaches and islands, along with ocean animals and plants. I was so proud of the children for all the work they put into the bulletin board. With the exception of a couple animals, all of the items on the board were created by them. They practiced counting, in Spanish, by gluing legs onto an octopus. In addition, they made fish, and sea stars (formally known as star fish) and sea weed. Aside from the board, they practiced sinking and floating by adding items to a container filled with water. After making their predictions, the children added their items (such as a cork, penny, pebble, popsicle stick, etc.) and noted which items sank and which floated, based on their predictions. Next a significant amount of salt was added to the same water and the children were astounded to see some of the items that sank previously, later floated. Our letters for May were E, I, O and U, with one review. Finally, feelings were a major part of our month. The children learned about sympathy/empathy. They also learned how a bad day may make a friend act differently (angry, upset, standoffish) and how they may need a little extra compassion. Speaking of feelings, I had to come to terms with my own. As a teacher, I am always so proud of my students when they take that next step in their lives. Letting go of them is a different story altogether. Your children have taught me as much. I have never felt as blessed as I do right now. Thank you for entrusting me with them and thank you for being as wonderful as you are. I could not have gotten through this year, as well as I have, without their bright, shiny faces, their eagerness to learn, and, above all, your support. Thank you for all of your suggestions and all of the blessing you have bestowed upon me. I adore your child(ren) and am so happy I was able to spend as much time with them as I did. We've been finishing the letters of the alphabet with our vowels. We will continue to have show & tell up until the last week of school so please continue to send items in with your child. In addition, I wanted to thank everyone for all my wonderful gifts during teacher appreciation week.
